With two short states ahead of her, San Francisco Bay area singer/songwriter Aprylle Gilbert is in the final week of her Charity Run for Kids

Connecticut – Rhode Island Border: In Connecticut, Gilbert was hosted in the homes of two Route 6 legends. She was thrilled to spend a night with her Route 6 idol, New England journalist Joe Hurley, who walked The 6 in 2005. During her run Gilbert was continually inspired and guided by the story of Hurley's 9-month cross-country adventure described in his book: 10 Million Steps: A fresh look at American and Americans from Cape Code to California on Route 6 (Available on the Route 6 Tourist Association web site. See link below).

She also stayed two nights with Malerie Yohen-Cohen, a journalist much admired by Gilbert for the book *Stay on Route 6: Your Guide to All 3,652 Miles of Transcontinental Route 6.* Yohen-Cohen's book is considered the definitive guidebook of the highway (*Also available on the Route 6 Tourist Association web site*).

Gilbert expects to conclude her run in Provincetown, MA on Sept 15. With nearly 4,000 miles to her credit, she will be the first person to run along the 3,652 miles of Historic Route 6 from Long Beach CA to Provincetown MA.

Gilbert is an extreme-distance runner, musician, author, and gifted photographer (just look at the photos on her FB page). Her coast-to-coast charity run is in support of Washington United Youth Center in Santa Clara County, CA, a non-profit organization providing after-school programs for underserved kids.
